On October 22 and 23, 2020, the employer negotiating committees invited all of the union negotiating teams to a coordinated presentation.

After the Centrale des syndicats du Québec (CSQ) and its President, Sonia Ethier, denounced the government for its failures at the negotiating tables, there was some movement by the Treasury Board at the tables.

During these two days of meetings, the employer party announced that they would be asking each negotiating table to significantly prune their demands with the aim of reaching a settlement as soon as possible.

The Fédération du personnel de soutien scolaire (FPSS-CSQ) welcomes the pruning of employer demands made this week at the Francophone support staff table as well as at the Anglophone, Cree and Kativik tables. It notes, however, that an even more significant pruning of union demands had been attempted last May at the Anglophone tables, but had subsequently received no response from the employer party.

The FPSS-CSQ deplores that the government is sticking to its ridiculously sparse financial envelope that does nothing to address the difficulties of labour shortages by improving working conditions.

This is why the FPSS-CSQ is urging the government to adopt an open approach at the five tables where the working conditions of the CSQ's school support staff are discussed.
