




#### National School Support Staff Week

#### **About Us**

The Fédération du personnel de soutien scolaire (FPSS-CSQ) is the only federation exclusively representing school support staff in Quebec schools, school service centers, and school boards.

Taking its rightful place, earning respect, and promoting the development of the 81 job classes it represents are among the major objectives set by the FPSS-CSQ.

With more than 43,000 members, the Federation has the power to foster a workplace environment for school support staff where the working conditions of each profession are respected by the employer. Along with colleagues from other federations, it contributes to developing real solidarity within the community.

The Federation enjoys the undeniable advantage of being part of the extended family of the Centrale des syndicats du Québec (CSQ). This allows it to benefit from the full expertise of the Centrale, which constitutes a true force in education and public services.

## The Mission of the FPSS-CSQ

The primary mission of the FPSS-CSQ is to promote and develop the social, cultural, and professional interests of school support staff, in addition to defending the right to association, free negotiations, and freedom to engage in union actions.

The Federation also aims to guide and coordinate the representation of its affiliated unions before the Centrale's governing bodies, as well as to support them wherever their interests and rights are being addressed.

In this regard, according to the Centrale's bylaws, the Federation assumes priority sectoral responsibility for negotiations, labor relations in general, legal action, and professional matters.



#### **A Little History**

Founded in August 1998, the Fédération du personnel de soutien scolaire (FPSS-CSQ) became the only federation exclusively representing school support staff in schools, school service centers, and school boards. Previously, in 1974, it was a federation representing support staff from school boards, colleges, universities, cafeterias and other groups working in education. In 1998, the school sector unions expressed their desire to regroup based on their common concerns

#### The Local Union

The local union has the latitude required to achieve the goals it has set for itself. It also enjoys the autonomy inherent in the unionism of our Federation. Upholding the values embedded in our organization is also reflected in our structure. It is important that each local union team is given the best information and adequate training to enable it to achieve its objectives.

The Federation's organizational structure is designed to provide local elected officials with all the support (technical and legal) they require, thus ensuring the best possible representation of members before union or employer bodies, facilitating the interventions required to defend and promote the professional lives of members.

Those elected to the local union participate in our democratic process by assuming dual representation. At all provincial meetings, they are invited to participate in debates, to express their members' concerns regarding current issues, and to include local concerns on the agenda of these provincial meetings.

The local union is composed of a team of people released to perform their duties and develop intermediate structures and professional life committees that meet the needs of members.



#### **Services**

#### The FPSS-CSQ:

- Is the only organization dedicated exclusively to the needs of school support staff.
- Is autonomous within the CSQ.
- Negotiates for and on behalf of its rank-and-file members.
- Is democratic, strong, active, attentive, and close to its members.
- Offers quality services to affiliated unions and a presence in the community at no additional cost.
- Offers several specific services to Anglophone unions.


#### THE CSQ:

- Brings together a large number of employees from the education and public service sectors.
- Develops teamwork practices:
   school teams and center teams.
   The three personnel categories
   (support staff, teachers and
   professionals) work together
   daily for the same goal: to provide
   students with the best preparation
   for their personal and professional lives.
- Provides reference tools such as management databases designed to provide union officers with quick access to the information required to serve their member

#### **Financial Aspect**

Members of unions affiliated with the FPSS-CSQ determine what their dues will be at their own general assemblies. The minimum contribution to be entitled to all services is 1.5%. It is distributed in such a way as to generate a significant operating budget for each union, since an average of 0.87% of the dues remain in the local union's coffers, giving it adequate financial resources to provide quality services that meet their members' expectations. Specifically, these funds allow for union release time and the provision of direct services to members in the community, in addition to allowing unions to:

- Represent and defend the rights of their members.
- Meet with members, welcome them, and listen to them.
- Undertake concrete actions to enforce the collective agreement.
- Monitor cases at the local level.
- Foster the dynamic professional lives of school support staff.



## A Democratic Federation

#### THE CONGRESS

The Congress is the Federation's supreme body, where each union is invited to participate with an expanded delegation to determine the major or special objectives, main lines of action, and the broad priorities that will form the basis of our collective work for the next three years. Delegates also elect the members of the Federation's Executive committee and adopt any required amendments to the Federation's statutes, regulations, and policies.

The Congress is a special time for all constituents of the Federation to reflect on and determine our objectives.

## THE FEDERAL COUNCIL

The Federation is governed by a Federal Council composed of delegates from each union. Its role is to ensure that the action plan will facilitate the implementation of the objectives adopted by the Congress.

The Federal Council examines all issues related to professional life, including those relating to the provincial negotiation process, and debates them in order to make the required decisions.

The Federal Council acts as a pivot between members and their union, the Federation, and the Centrale.

## THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The three elected members come from the education sector and are released full-time to devote themselves exclusively to their federation duties. They are responsible for coordinating all activities related to the representation, promotion, and defense of school support staff.



## Éric Pronovost PRESIDENT

Éric Pronovost has held the position of President of the FPSS-CSQ since July 1, 2013.

He served for three years on the FPSS-CSQ Executive Committee as Vice President of Communications, Secretariat, and Treasury.

Previously, he was an advisor responsible for daycare services for the Syndicat du personnel de soutien de la Commission scolaire des Premières-Seigneuries. He also served as Vice President of Labor Relations and President of his local union.
